Beyond The Classroom

- UMKC has the first Bachelor of Architecture at a public institution in Missouri and the only public, urban Architecture program in the region.
- Our students learn to be architects within 20 miles of **75+ architecture firms**.
- Our studios provide an **open, collaborative** environment where students spend at least 9 course hours per week on design projects that emulate a design firm.
- Our program has no required summer courses, so students are able to spend that time completing internships.
- Local professional architects join students in studio to critique their work.
- Each year, Helix Architecture + Design sponsors the Helix Prize, a competition and scholarship for UMKC second-year Architecture students.



Personalize Your Degree

- Begin building your portfolio from your first semester at UMKC! Students are encouraged to put their own spin on designs, which provides a very personalized feel to their portfolio.
- During their fifth year, students get to choose their own project type as part of a thesis.
- Students take Professional Support Electives
 that echo the research of our faculty. Topics
 might include sustainability, building
 construction systems, focus on a specific building
 type, architectural history and preservation, or
 architectural theory.

After Graduation



- SSE connects students with industry partners in the area through information sessions and two STEM Career Fairs every year.
- Kansas City is considered a hub for architecture in the United States. Dozens of architecture and engineering companies are headquartered in Kansas City including BNIM Architects, HOK, HNTB, and Populous.
- Join local organizations like American Institute
